



HCL POSTING ADVANTAGE FOR ENTRY TO SAP SCHOOLS WILL CONTINUE*

- Students' HCL results will be denoted as 'D' (Distinction), 'M' (Merit) or 'P' (Pass).
- Students will be ranked taking into account their performance in HCL.
- This posting advantage applies before the tie-breakers for S1 Posting.





EXAMPLE OF AN SAP SCHOOL'S INDICATIVE PSLE SCORE RANGE

While students need not take HCL to enter SAP schools, students who pass HCL receive a
posting advantage for admission. To reflect this, the indicative PSLE Score ranges of SAP

WHAT THE INDICATIVE PSLE SCORE RANGES SHOW

Fewer possible PSLE Scores.

- Schools would also be less differentiated by COPs
- Wider range (More) of secondary schools to choose from.
- Schools' indicative PSLE Score ranges have remained largely stable in recent years.
 - Vary from year to year depending on cohort's PSLE results and school choices
 - Fluctuations of +/-1 AL for AL COPs are typical



How to reduce Careless Mistakes?

- Avoid skipping several steps at one time.
- Manage your time well
- Answer the right question. Break down long questions
- Highlight (underline/circle) for keywords / numbers / information
- Keep track of your mistakes made during practice and check them during examinations.





How to reduce Careless Mistakes?

- Habit of checking
- Check for errors in copying and transfer
- Check the units
- Check the calculations and do a REVERSE-CHECK. Put your answer back into the maths problem or equation to check.
- Check for logic







PSLE/S1 Posting Process

- Based on a student's PSLE score

DSA-Sec

 They will also NOT be allowed to transfer to another school after the release of the PSLE results.
